Moos Family Speaker Series on Water Resources presents...

'Not Just for Scientists Anymore: Why the Public Should Care About the Connection Between Groundwater and Lakes, Streams and Wetlands'

White Bear Lake, where pumping from municipal wells has been blamed for drying up huge parts of the lake, has become a graphic illustration of the interaction between groundwater and lakes, streams and wetlands.

Join us for a free public lecture by U.S. Geological Survey hydrologist Don Rosenberry on the importance of the groundwater connection – in the shrinking White Bear Lake, in other lakes and streams across Minnesota, and beyond.

Rosenberry will discuss the physical, chemical and biological processes linking groundwater and surface waters and their impacts on humans in floods and droughts.

Rosenberry, who took part in the White Bear Lake research, is a native Minnesotan, now living in Colorado. He coordinates a long-term USGS research project on Shingobee Lake, near Park Rapids.
